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Objectives:

- To let the students learn about and explore the work of the Urban Renewal Authority (URA).
- To enhance the students' ability in doing research, and train them to think critically from different perspectives.

Activity Format:

Collecting facts and information (outside class)

Recommendations:

- Guide the students to examine the work of urban renewal and URA's current policies from various angles, such as economic, social, cultural and environmental perspectives.
- Guide the students to understand the benefits and difficulties experienced by different stakeholders in the process of urban regeneration, while appreciating their attitudes and opinions.
- The design of the worksheet aims to stimulate thinking and analysis of the students. Teachers may need to assist the students in comprehending the questions.

Reference Topics:

- Analyse the pros and cons of the URA's 'flat-for-flat' pilot scheme.
- Does the URA's current compensation policy satisfy the needs of the people affected by its projects?
- Is redevelopment or preservation of local characters more important? How can a balance between the two be stricken?

Procedure:

- 1. Divide students into 4 or 5 groups, each group with about 8 students;
- 2. Select topic(s) (no more than 2 is recommended) by teacher;
- 3. Distribute relevant data and newspaper clippings in class to enhance students' understanding of the topic(s);
- 4. Distribute the worksheet;
- 5. Ask students to collect facts and information about the topic outside class time, and then complete the worksheet and submit in the next lesson.

Extended Activity:

Allow the students to do preliminary discussion in class, based on the topic(s).
